

## Guidelines for Online Publication of Supplementary Material for *Psychological Science*

Authors are free to submit supplementary material and, if the manuscript is accepted for publication, such material will be published online at the publisher's website, linked to the article. However, such material must be supplementary and cannot be essential for the reader to understand the manuscript.

### *Conventions for naming files that contain supplementary material*

Each distinct item of supplementary material (e.g., a figure, a table) should appear in a separate file. Please use the following conventions for naming files:

- Any material that would appear as a table in the main text (e.g., a list of stimuli, additional results) should appear in files named Table S1, Table S2, etc.
- Additional figures should appear in files named Figure S1, Figure S2, etc.
- Videos should appear in files named Video S1, Video S2, etc.
- Files containing supplementary materials that do not fit into these categories should be given *brief* descriptive titles, such as Additional Analyses or Methodological Details. ### *Conventions for citing supplementary material within the manuscript*

“Table S2 in the supporting information available on-line presents findings for individual scenarios.”

“Serial-position curves for individuals are shown in Figure S1 in the supporting information available on-line.”
