Wendy Wood, provost professor of psychology and business at the University of Southern California, has been elected to serve as <u>President-Elect</u> of the Association for Psychological Science (APS). She will begin her three-year term—first as President-Elect, then President, and finally Immediate Past President—on June 1, following the <u>APS 2022 Annual Convention</u> in Chicago, Illinois, May 26 to 29.
