Miracle Fruit and Flavor: An Experiment Performed at APS 2010

The results are in! At Convention last year APS Past-President Linda Bartoshuk led a miracle fruit experiment with the audience during the Presidential Symposium in Boston, MA. Audience members tasted 'miracle fruit,' a freeze-dried West African berry, that changed the way they tasted fruit they ate afterwards.

Bartoshuk shared the results with attendees in a poster presentation at the APS 23rd Annual Convention in Washington, DC.

Synsepalum dulcificum berries (miracle fruit) affect the tongue such that sweet taste is added to acids. In a study of 823 subjects (APS 2010), after eating miracle fruit, strawberries and lemons were sweetened as expected; what's more, their flavors were also intensified. This effect has not previously been demonstrated.

The results were presented Saturday, May 28, 2011 from 12:00 PM – 1:00 PM in Columbia Hall.

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
